Port of Dundee welcomes the magnificent *Magellan* on her maiden voyage with Cruise & Maritime Voyages

The 1250 passenger cruise liner *Magellan* sailed into the Port of Dundee this weekend (29 March) for her inaugural visit on her maiden season under new owner, Cruise & Maritime Voyages.

Dundee is increasing in popularity for cruise holidays with sightseers benefiting from the waterfront investment in the city and also the close proximity to other places of interest. Magellan will call two more times this season and we look forward to welcoming her again in the future."

Mike Hall, Head of Marketing at CMV, owners of Magellan said: "Support for our cruise departures from Dundee and the area has been remarkable with more than 2,000 people choosing to cruise closer to home. We are pleased that it means good business for us and of course for the Dundee area with local transport companies, hotels, shops, suppliers and others benefitting. On Sunday (29th March) passengers already on Magellan enjoyed a day of sightseeing in Dundee, with many other passengers joining the ship for a 7 night Norwegian Fjords cruise

Magellan berthed at King George V Wharf at the port and will also call into Dundee on Easter Sunday (5 April) and 12th April for the 7 night Norwegian Fjords cruise.

Forth Ports has invested significantly in its cruise business which welcomes liners into both the River Tay and the River Forth at its ports in Dundee, Leith and Rosyth and also anchorage points in South Queensferry and Newhaven bringing over 80,000 passengers over the course of the 2015 season.
