Amazon UK to locate at Port of Tilbury's London Distribution Park

The strategically located development, which will provide high quality warehousing and 11 acres of haulage facilities, takes advantage of Tilbury's prime location to the UK's transport network and is on the doorstep of the M25 (J30/31).
