Forth Ports Limited is the Statutory Harbour Authority for the Port of Methil and the River Forth. This pre-arrival information is to inform you of important safety and environmental information that you will require whilst berthed in the Port of Methil.

You must make yourself aware of the following publications and forms that you may require prior to arriving at the Port of Methil:

Prior to arriving at the Port of Methil, you will require a Port Agent or representative of the vessel to make an application for a berth and book various marine services (such as pilotage and line-handling etc.) for your vessel.

Forth Ports Limited expect all vessels operating within the Statutory Harbour Authority area to comply with the Code of Safe Working Practices for Merchant Seafarers which can be found here https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/code-of-safe-working-practices-for-merchant-seafarers-2020

We ask that whilst in the Port of Methil, all crew adhere to the Life Saving Rules and all appropriate direction and signage within the port estate.

Ten Key Requirements for Port of Methil

The safety and security of all users of the Port of Methil is paramount, so we expect all users of the Port estate to follow the Port's requirements:

1 In Case of Emergency

In the event of an emergency raise the alarm as follows;

Emergency Services (Police, Fire, Ambulance) – 999

Forth & Tay Navigation Service (FTNS) via VHF CHANNEL 71 (Call sign "Forth Navigation") or by telephone 01324 498584.

Ensure you have the following information ready:

Who - Name

What - Details of Incident or event

Where - Location / Berth within the Port

When - Time of incident or event.



Security

Security is of highest importance. No person is permitted within the Port of Methil unless on lawful business.

Whilst in Port, you and your crew must be extra diligent with security. You are advised to carry out the following:

- Ensure all ships personnel have available photographic identification as this will be required to gain entry to the Port.
- All visitors to the Port must be logged with security, providing the visitors name, nature of visit and expected arrival time and they must produce photographic Identification to the local security gate on arrival.
- Temporary day passes must be obtained from Security Gate Houses for vehicles entering the Port.
- Young Persons under the age of 16 are not permitted on the Port unless prior approval has been received by Port Manager or Deputy. Contact FTNS for further details or visit Forth Ports website
- Never leave visitors or strangers alone on your vessel; ensure you escort them ashore.
- Maintain a gangway watch at all times
- Be suspicious and challenge any suspicious characters or activity and report to FTNS.



3	Smoking in Port	
	Smoking can only take place in designated places onboard your vessel unless the berth or Jetty operator specifies otherwise.	3
	The Port of Methil has a strictly NO SMOKING policy.	
4	Vessel Maintenance Whilst in Port	
	Painting Painting or chipping over the side of your ship is not permitted whilst in the Port of Methil.	
	Hot Work Consent No hot work or any work that produces a spark, flame or radiated heat is permitted on board your vessel unless you have first received consent for such work to take place from FTNS. To request a hot work permit please completed the form found on the website and send in an e-mail to FTNS@Forthports.co.uk	
	Diving Consent No diving is permitted unless you have first received consent from FTNS. If you require a diving Permit please email the completed form to FTNS@Forthports.co.uk https://www.forthports.co.uk/marine/permits-forms/	
	Use of Ships Boats If you require to lower any boat into the water, for any reason such as emergency drills, permission must first be obtained from FTNS, see Contact List for further guidance. Whilst permission may be granted by the Duty Harbour Master, when lowered into the water a boat must always remain within close proximity to your vessel.	
	Any works requiring the use of external contractors must be planned via the local agent to ensure the activities are coordinated through the relevant Port Departments.	
5	Bunkering Operations	
	Bunkering from shore to ship is the only way you can take on fuel whilst in the Port of Methil. Please arrange all bunkering through your local agent.

6 Fresh Water Provision & Black/Grey Water Disposal

Fresh Water is not provided at the Port of Methi

Disposal of Black or Grey water must be arranged via local agent, as this must not be discharged into the dock.

7 Port Waste Reception Facilities

Port of Methil provide waste reception facilities for General Waste and International Catering Waste.

These facilities are provided to ensure that all vessel generated waste must be disposed of in an environmentally sustainable and legally correct manner.

International Food Waste – all food stuffs or items that have been produced whilst travelling outside the EU. This waste requires Category 1 disposal and must be placed in a designated ICW receptacle only.

General waste - (e.g. office waste, paper etc.) including recycling such as plastics and cans – these will be separated out at the waste contractor depot.

All other wastes must be removed via a port approved licensed waste contractor and organised by the ships agent.

- Such wastes could include: pallets, oils and oily contaminated materials, paints/paint pots, chemicals, cargo residues (e.g. dunnage), scrap, clinical/medical waste, batteries, sewage.
- This waste must not be placed on the quayside until waste provider is onsite and must be collected prior to vessels departure.

Charges are made for the waste reception facilities for all vessels – these can be found in the Port Tariff via your local agent.

A copy of the approved Port Waste Plan can be found on the Forth Ports Website.

Annex V of MARPOL has been put into place to minimise the pollution of garbage from ships.

The Port of Methil does not tolerate pollution from any hazardous or non-hazardous garbage, whether it is in the water or on the quayside.

Persons throwing or emptying garbage into the water or onto the quayside may be liable for prosecution.



8 Crew on the quayside

The operational area of the port is an area of high activity

Designated pedestrian walkways and exit routes, marked on the port traffic management plan (attached) must be used

Unauthorised vehicles (e.g. Taxis) are not permitted within operational areas (e.g. Quayside). This includes collections and drops offs. In addition, the riding of bicycles is not permitted within the operational area (e.g. Quayside).

Designated Taxi Pick-up/Drop off points are located throughout the Port estate – see Traffic Management Plan within this pack.



Safe Means of Access

Merchant Shipping and Fishing Vessels (Health and Safety at Work) Regulations 1997 & MGN533 Means of Access are strictly enforced. Failure to provide safe means of access will not be tolerated and may result in delays to cargo

Code of Safe Working Practices Ch. 22

'Safe means of access must be provided between the safe working environment on board, as required by the



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Safe Access - Merchant Shipping and Fishing Vessels
(Health and Safety at Work) Regulations 1997,
regulation 5(2)(e). Following the principles and guidance
in this chapter will generally be considered to
demonstrate compliance with the duty to ensure a safe
working environment on board ship. Where different
measures are taken to provide a safe means of access,
these alternative measures must provide at least an
equivalent level of safety in the operating conditions at
the time."
